In addition, there are a number of recognised national and international protected sites such as the Campsie Fells which is a Local Landscape Area, the Antonine Wall World Heritage Site, the Forth and Clyde Canal Scheduled Monument and natural designations such as SSSI.  Although the SG will provide guidance for developments, which have the potential to be located within or near to sensitive or protected areas, the Local Development Plan contains policies which apply appropriate safeguards to such areas and these policies have been subject to environmental assessment. It is not considered that the Design & Placemaking SG would be likely to introduce any significant environmental effects additional to those which would be considered through the assessed LDP policies. In addition, other guidance such as the Town and Country Planning (Development Management Procedure) (Scotland) Regulation 2013 exists which provides protection

for sensitive sites.


However, the SG should consider vulnerable and protected sites in East Dunbartonshire to ensure that the guidelines are sensitive to such sites and take into account design principles that maintain the sites' values.

It is anticipated that the SG will not exceed environmental quality standards or limit values, or result in intensive land use.

East Dunbartonshire Council Design and Placemaking Supplementary Guidance - Screening Report

Thank you for your Screening Report consultation which SEPA received via the Scottish Government SEA Gateway on 7 September 2015.

In accordance with Section 9(3) of the Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act 2005 we have considered your screening report using the criteria set out in Schedule 2 for determining the likely significance of effects on the environment. Having reviewed the Screening Report, we consider that in respect of our main areas of interest (air, water, soil, human health, material assets (of which we have a specific interest in waste) and climatic factors) the plan is unlikely to have significant environmental effects. Although we are of the view that significant environmental effects are not likely, it is for East Dunbartonshire Council as Responsible Authority to make a formal determination taking into account the consultation responses received.

If it is formally determined that SEA is required, you will be aware that the next stage requires the Responsible Authority to consult the Consultation Authorities on the proposed scope and level of detail to be included within the Environmental Report. This can be undertaken through preparation of a concise Scoping Report. We would encourage you to use the scoping process to focus the assessment on those SEA issues upon which there are likely to be significant environmental effects, to outline the baseline information you consider as most relevant and explain your proposed method of assessment. To assist with this process we have produced <a href="Standing Advice for Responsible Authorities">Standing Advice for Responsible Authorities</a> on Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) Scoping Consultations.

We are committed to providing early and focused advice and supporting continuous engagement and would therefore welcome the opportunity to meet with you and discuss these issues prior to the formal consultation.
