STEP 4 – STATEMENT OF THE FINDINGS OF THE SCREENING

Summary of interactions with the environment and statement of the findings of the Screening: (Including an outline of the likely significance of any interactions, positive or negative, and explanation of conclusion of the screening exercise.)

The Strategy will recognise the importance of sports pitches and their provision for open space (natural grass pitches) and recreation (both natural grass and 3G pitch facilities) in East Dunbartonshire, particularly in more urban areas. However, the scope of the Strategy does not extend to identifying particular new sites or options and the effects regarding health and wellbeing are likely to be minimal and localised in nature.

Whilst it is anticipated that the Strategy will have a positive impact, to an extent, the overall environmental impacts of the Strategy itself are unlikely to be significant. Therefore, it has been determined that, under Section 5(3) of the Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act 2005, a full SEA is not required.
